

# **MARKET HIGHLIGHTS**

- GTA August resale volume spiked by 40.3% versus August 2019; this brought year-to-date volume to just 3.9% below 2019 levels
- Low-rise market segments (detached, semidetached and townhouses) main drivers of growth (up by 50.6%, 66.8% and 45.8% respectively)
- Improving economic conditions, low borrowing costs and pent-up demand due to the "COVID pause" main factors spurring demand
- MLS® Home Price Index (apples-to-apples reading) up by 11.1% versus August 2019; average selling price of \$951,404 up by 20.1% versus last year




