

Bank regulator hints of change to mortgage 'stress test' before year's end

The Office of the Superintendent of Financial Institutions (OSFI) recently released a statement suggesting that it could make "adjustments" to its qualifying mortgage stress rate before the end of the year. Each December, the regulator reviews and conveys to the public the gualifying rate, ahead of the following year's busy spring housing season. However, OSFI's recent statement indicated that a change could come before the end of the year. The current rules require homebuyers to demonstrate they can shoulder mortgage payments at an interest rate of 5.25% or their current mortgage contract rate plus 2%, whichever is higher. According to many industry experts, the current rules are pushing a lot of would-be homebuyers out of the market and a change is therefore warranted.
